March 12, 13, 14, and 15, 2009

The Jackson Hole Invitational is a non-qualifying competition sanctioned by United States Figure Skating (US Figure Skating). The Jackson Hole Invitational will be conducted according to the rules set forth in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rulebook and in the Technical Notifications published on the US Figure Skating Website.

ELIGIBILITY

Skaters must be registered members of US Figure Skating or friendly foreign federations. Skaters representing a foreign association must include official permission of their Association or Federation.

UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED IN THIS ANNOUNCEMENT, COMPETITORS MAY ENTER ONE CLASS HIGHER THAN THEIR TEST LEVEL AS OF JANUARY 26, 2009.

Eligibility for the basic skills part of the competition

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills Program/Club or any other Basic Skills Program/Club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8 must skate at highest level passed and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances. For the Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

ENTRIES

Entries will close on January 26, 2009, and must be postmarked by that date. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee and will be charged a \$20.00 late fee. Entry fees and completed forms for each event entered must be sent together. A minimum of two entries will make an event. All events are separate. No refunds will be issued after the close of entries on January 26, 2009.

RINK FACILITIES

The Snow King Ice Arena has an indoor ice surface 200' x 85' with rounded corners. Dressing rooms and snack bar facilities are available. There is bleacher seating in the arena.

REGISTRATION AND MUSIC

The registration desk will open in the competition arena at 4:00 p.m. March 11, 2009. **Skaters are required to check in at the registration desk at least one (1) hour prior to their first scheduled event.**

All competitors except dance and interpretive improvisation must provide their own music on CDs. **The CD must be clearly marked with the skater's name, and event.** Music must start at the beginning of the CD with no more than a 10 second leader. Each CD must have only music for one program on it, please only provide music burned on CD/Rs...some older CD players will not play music burned on CD/RWs. Please have back-up CDs available.

Music must be turned in one (1) hour prior to the event to be skated. You may pick up your music after performance.

OFFICIAL NOTES

A bulletin board displaying official information will be located in the arena lobby. Posting on this board will be considered sufficient notice to all competitors.

CHANGES TO EVENT ENTRIES

Changes or additions to event entries after skating the orders are posted will be permitted at the discretion of the Chief Accountant. If the changes/additions are permitted by the Chief Accountant, a \$10/event change fee will be collected by the JHFSC.

AWARDS

Medals will be presented to the top three (3) winners in each group. Ribbons will be presented to the fourth place winner in each group. All Basic Skills not in 1st through 4th place will receive participant ribbons. Trophies will be presented to the top three winners of the Intermediate through Senior Combined Short & Long Program (medals will be presented for the individual short and long program winners). There will be no final rounds.

There will be a 1st, 2nd & 3rd place Team Trophy awarded to the clubs with most points at the end of the competition, using a scoring system for each event as follows 1st place=5 points / 2nd place=3 points / 3rd place=1 point. **No points for team events.** The Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club is ineligible to receive a Team Trophy.

The Artistry Award. The judges will give this award to a skater Juvenile (Adult Gold) or higher who skates the most artistic Free Skate or Artistic program at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

The Sherrie Fleuter Award. The judges will give this award to a skater of any level who demonstrates excellence in both artistic and freestyle skating and also represents the spirit of figure skating at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

The Stacey Findorff Award. The judges will give this award to a skater who is at the Basic Skills through Non-Test level and demonstrates excellence in both artistic and freestyle skating while also representing the spirit of Figure Skating at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

The Stillwell Award. The judges will give this award to a skater of any level who performs the most highly entertaining and creative showcase program at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHS

An attempt will be made to provide videotaping and photography. Personal videotaping is allowed only with the permission of the competition chairman and is restricted to the arena bleachers, hand carried equipment only, and may not be connected to the rink electricity. A photographer will be present at the awards ceremonies. Picture arrangements may be made with him. No flash pictures may be taken by individuals at the award ceremonies.

EVENTS

The following Men's and Ladies events will be offered:

Compulsory Moves: Basic Skills (Beginning Tots through Freeskate 6), Non-Test, Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile, and Adult Non-Test through Adult Gold/Masters.

Basic Skills Free Skate: Beginning Tots through Basic 8 and Free Skate 1 through 6

Free Skate: Non-Test, Pre-Preliminary thru Senior, & Adult Non-Test through Adult Masters. Intermediate through Senior events are combined Short Program and Freestyle.

Pairs: Pre-Juvenile through Senior. Novice through Senior events are combined Short Program and Freestyle.

Artistic:	Non-Test, Pre-Preliminary through Senior (<i>Adults please see the Adult Interpretive</i>)
Showcase:	Non-Test, Pre-Preliminary through Senior (<i>Adults please see the Adult Interpretive</i>)
Adult Interpretive:	Adult Interpretive and Adult Masters Interpretive.
Solo Dance:	Preliminary through Gold.
Interpretive Improv:	Non-Test, Pre-Preliminary through Senior, and Adult Non-Test through Adult Masters.
Team Events:	Pre-Preliminary through Senior (<i>Adults may join or form teams at their equivalent level</i>).

“NEW” Gong Artistic/Showcase Pre-Preliminary through Senior (Adult Pre-Bronze – Master) See separate Entry Form

All Beginning Tots, Basic Skills, Free Skate 1 through 6, and Non-Test Events will be grouped by age, if possible. Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile Freestyle and Adult Non-Test through Adult Masters Freestyle will also be grouped by age, if possible. All other events may be split at the discretion of the referee. All events may be combined or split at the referee's discretion.

Artistic will be skated as a rhythmic interpretation to music of the skater's choice. It will be judged on composition and style. The difficulty of jumps will be given no weight in the marks. Vocal music is permitted. Skaters are encouraged to wear conservative costumes, appropriate for their music. No props are allowed, including hand held. At the discretion of the referee, groups may be combined and/or divided according to the number of skaters entered.

Showcase will be skated to music of the skater's choice. This is a costume event. Costumes can be appropriate to the theme of the music. Props are limited to one trip on the ice, must be carried by skater and may not alter the ice surface, i.e. fire or water. Event will be judged on interpretation, style, composition and entertainment appeal.

Adult Interpretive and Adult Masters Interpretive Free Skating will consist of variety of skating moves and elements selected for their value in the skater's interpretation of the music (vocal music is permitted). Costumes that enhance the performance by appropriately reflecting the character of the music, thereby enhancing the theme, will be considered in the judging. Props on the ice will not be permitted. Judging will be based on both skating technique *and* presentation.

Solo Dance: There will be one round in each of the solo categories.

Interpretive Improv music will be played during the skaters group warm up, skaters will listen to music selected twice. Skaters will then skate to the music. Judging will be based on interpretation, style, and composition. Professionals will not be allowed to help skaters in this event. Conservative dress is encouraged.

Team Events will be judged on the 4 elements for each level.

JUDGING SYSTEM

All events except for the Juvenile through Senior Free Skate will be judged using the 6.0 closed judging system. Intermediate through Senior Short Programs and Juvenile through Senior Free Skate Events will be judged in accordance with the new Code Of Points judging system (ISU Judging System). **ALL SKATERS IN THESE CODE-OF-POINTS-JUDGED-EVENTS MUST SUBMIT THE PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM WITH THEIR ENTRY FORM.**

PRACTICE ICE

Each twenty (20) minute practice session will cost \$10.00. You must enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope to receive advance notice of your practice ice. Practice ice money is non-refundable. **You must bring your own tape or CD for practice ice.** Practice ice will be assigned in the order of receipt of reservations. See the **Practice Ice Request Form** for specifics.

COACH REGISTRATION

NEW THIS YEAR! All coaches will have to comply with the coaches' registration policy in order to be allowed to instruct and coach at the JHFSC invitational. Coaches will need to check-in at the registration desk and show proof of your U.S. Figure Skating Coach Registration Card and a photo ID. We will then issue you a photo ID for this competition that will allow you to coach on all practice ice and during the competition. If you have not done your background check with U.S. Figure Skating please do so before January 26, 2009. If you have not registered before the competition and do not have your card and photo ID, you will NOT be allowed a credential. **The only exception is for coaches under 18 years of age or for coaches who only have Basic Skills students.**

HOSPITALITY FEE

All skaters will pay a \$15.00 fee. This fee helps to cover the cost Saturday night's party, goodie bag items, and other miscellaneous costs associated with the competition. **All skaters will pay the hospitality fee, even if they choose not to attend the Wild West Party.** Please see attached information sheet for more information about Saturday night's party!

Non-test -- Open to skaters who have passed no US Figure Skating test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

6. Scratch spin (minimum: 2 revolutions)

Pre-Preliminary -- Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Salchow/toe loop combination
2. Forward spiral
3. Jump combination: waltz/toe loop
4. Single jump (no axel)
5. Connecting steps
6. One-foot spin--no change of position (minimum: 3 revolutions)

Preliminary -- Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Preliminary Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Salchow
2. Forward spiral or Ina Bauer
3. Camel spin/one foot spin (minimum: 3 revolutions)
4. Connecting steps
5. Sit spin (minimum: 3 revolutions)
6. Jump combination: 2 single jumps (no change of foot, or turn in between, axel permitted).

COMPULSORY MOVES (Continued)

Pre-Juvenile -- Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:15 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Lutz jump
2. Ina Bauer or spread eagle
3. Double jump
4. Connecting steps
5. Jump combination consisting of single jumps - no change of foot or turn between. (The loop jump must be the second jump).
6. Combination spin with no change of foot and one change of position (minimum: 3 rev. in each position).

Juvenile -- Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Juvenile Freestyle test and are 12 years and under as of January 26, 2008. No music; Time - 1:15 maximum; Full ice surface.

2. Straight line step sequence
3. Backward to forward spiral
4. Women layback spin. Men forward camel.
5. Jumps combination consisting of a double, single, or two single jumps (no change of foot and no turn in between).
6. Spin combination with one change of foot and one change of position (minimum: 4 revolutions on each foot).

Open Juvenile -- Same as Juvenile except 13 years and older as of January 26, 2009.

Adult Non-Test -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed no US Figure Skating tests (Skate with Us Adult 1-4 tests OK). No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Two-foot spin (minimum: 3 revolutions)
2. Forward Edges (minimum 2 outside and 2 inside, skated consecutively)
3. Bunny Hop
4. Lunge
5. Forward Inside Pivot

Adult Pre-Bronze -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Pre-Bronze Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Waltz Jump
2. Toe-Loop
3. Half-Flip – Half-Flip combination
4. One Foot Spin (min. 3 revolutions)
5. Spiral

Adult Bronze -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Bronze Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Salchow
2. Toe-Loop
3. Waltz-Toe-Loop combination
4. Sit spin (min. 3 revolutions)
5. Circular footwork sequence

Adult Silver -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Silver Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:30 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Flip
2. Loop
3. Single-Single combination jump
4. Camel Spin (min 3 revs in position)
5. Back spin
6. Straight-line footwork sequence

Adult Gold/Masters -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Gold Freestyle test or the US Figure Skating Juvenile (or higher) Freestyle Test. No music; Time - 1:30 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Axel
2. Lutz-Loop combination
3. Camel back sit spin (minimum 4 revolutions each)
4. Circular footwork sequence
5. Layback (ladies) or Cross-foot (men) spin

BASIC SKILLS FREE SKATING EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM – BASIC 8

- The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise specified.
- To be skated on full ice
- Vocal music is allowed
- The skater may use elements from a previous level
- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- Time: 1:00 +/- 10 seconds

Music for any and all categories must be **instrumental** only. If necessary, groups will be divided by age or random draw. Short program elements shall be as specified for the 2009-2010 season.

Non-test --Must not have passed any US Figure Skating Free Skating Tests and be age 17 or under. All single jumps are permitted, except Axel, and may be repeated alone or in combination. No Axels, multi-revolution jumps, jumped or flying spins are allowed. Deductions will be made for jumps and spins that are not allowed. Program duration 1:30.

Pre-Preliminary Free Skate -- Must not have passed the US Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating Test and be age 17 or under. All single jumps are permitted, including Axel, and may be repeated alone or in combination. No multi-revolution jumps, jumped or flying spins are allowed. Deductions will be made for jumps and spins that are not allowed. Program duration 1:30 and skated in accordance with 3711 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Preliminary Free Skate -- Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test and be age 17 or under. All single jumps are permitted, including Axel, and any 2 double jumps may be repeated alone or in combination. Deductions will be made for jumps that are not allowed. Program duration 1:30 and skated in accordance with 3700 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Pre-Juvenile Free Skate -- Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skating Test. All single jumps are permitted, including Axel, and any 3 double jumps may be repeated alone or in combination. Deductions will be made for jumps that are not allowed. Program duration 2:00 and skated in accordance with 3691 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Open Juvenile Free Skate -- Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating Test and be age 13 or over. Otherwise, the same rules as for Juvenile Free Skate.

Juvenile Free Skate -- Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating Test and be 12 years of age or under. Program duration 2:15 and skated in accordance with 3681 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Skaters in this event must submit the Planned Program Content Form with their Official Entry Form.

Intermediate Free Skate - Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Novice Free Skating Test. Short program shall not exceed 2:00 with required elements stated in 3671 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Long program duration 2:30 and skated in accordance with 3672 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Skaters in this event must submit the Planned Program Content Form with their Official Entry Form.

Novice Free Skate -- Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Junior Free Skating Test. Short program shall not exceed 2:30 with required elements stated in 3661(men) and 3662(ladies) in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Long program duration ladies' 3:00 and men's 3:30 and skated in accordance with 3663 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Skaters in this event must submit the Planned Program Content Form with their Official Entry Form.

Junior Free Skate -- Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Novice Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Senior Free Skating Test. Short program shall not exceed 2:50 with required elements stated in 3651-Group B (men) and 3652-Group B (ladies) in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Long program duration ladies' 3:30 minutes and men's 4:00 and skated in accordance with 3653 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Skaters in this event must submit the Planned Program Content Form with their Official Entry Form.

Senior Free Skate -- Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Junior Free Skating Test. Short program shall not exceed 2:50, and be skated in accordance with 3641 and 3642 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Long program duration ladies' 4:00 and men's 4:30 and skated in accordance with 3643 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book. Skaters in this event must submit the Planned Program Content Form with their Official Entry Form.

Adult Non-Test -- Shall be 21 years or older and shall not have passed any US Figure Skating tests (Adult 1-4 OK). Only half jumps, Salchows, and Toe-Loop jumps are allowed. Program maximum length of 1:30.

Adult Pre-Bronze -- Shall be 21 years or older and shall not have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Bronze or Preliminary Free Skating Test. All single jumps except Lutz and Axel are allowed. Program maximum length of 1:40 and skated in accordance with 3806 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

FREE SKATING EVENTS (Continued)

Adult Bronze -- Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Pre-Bronze or Pre-Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Adult Silver or Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test. No axels and no double jumps are allowed. Program maximum length of 1:40 and skated in accordance with 3801 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Adult Silver -- Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Bronze or Pre-Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Adult Gold or Juvenile Free Skating Test. Axels are permitted, but no double jumps are allowed. Program maximum length of 2:10 and skated in accordance with 3791 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Adult Gold -- Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Silver or Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating Test. Program maximum length of 2:40 and skated in accordance with 3781 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Adult Masters -- Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Gold Free Skating Test or the US Figure Skating Juvenile (or higher) Free Skating Test. Program maximum length of 3:40 and skated in accordance with 3741 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

ARTISTIC EVENTS

Open to skaters in Non-Test, Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, Open Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels (*Adults please see the Adult Interpretive/Masters Interpretive Event*). **Non-Test groups will be determined by the skater's age.**

Qualifications to compete in a given level are the same as the requirements for the same freestyle level. Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Interpretation, style and composition shall be factors in determining the mark given. Conservative skating costumes are encouraged. No props will be allowed including hand held. Skaters will skate to music of their choice (instrument or vocals). At the discretion of the referee, groups may be combined and /or divided according to the number of skaters entered. Men and women may compete against each other.

The program duration for Non-test shall be 1:00-1:30. The program duration for Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary shall be 1:30. The program duration for Pre-Juvenile through Open Juvenile shall be 2:00. The program duration for Intermediate shall be 2:30. The program duration for Novice, Junior and Senior level shall be 2:45.

SHOWCASE

Open to skaters in Non-test, Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, Open Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels (*Adults please see the Adult Interpretive/Masters Interpretive Event*). **Non-Test groups will be determined by the skater's age.**

Qualifications to compete in a given level are the same as the requirements for the free skating level. Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Interpretation, style, composition, and entertainment appeal shall be factors in determining the mark given. Costumes can be appropriate to the theme of the music. Any props must be carried on and off the ice by the skater. Men and women may compete against each other.

The program duration for Non-test shall be 1:00-1:30. The program duration for Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary shall be one and 1:30. The program duration for Pre-Juvenile through Senior shall be 2:00.

ADULT INTERPRETIVE/MASTERS INTERPRETIVE

Adult Interpretive and Adult Masters Interpretive Free Skating shall consist of a variety of skating moves and elements selected for their value in enhancing the skater's interpretation of the music he or she has chosen. Axels and double jumps will not be permitted. Costumes that enhance the performance by appropriately reflecting the character of the music, thereby enhancing the theme, will be considered in the judging. Props on the ice will not be permitted. Two marks will be given by the judges...the first for **Skating Technique** and the second for **Presentation**. **Skating Technique** includes: the ease, flow, glide, sureness, power, and depth of edges; the ability to vary the speed and direction of the skating; the variety of expressive and innovative moves; the succession of movement within the program; the utilization of space and ice coverage; and style. **Presentation** includes: the interpretation of the music and rhythm; the skater's musical timing and understanding of the phrasing of music; the use of the entire body to develop artistic and music expression; creativity; choreography and the art of arranging movements; variations in tempo, tension, emotion, and movements; the suitability of the music to the skater; and the internal motivation of movements and expression projected to the audience. Vocal music is permitted.

Adult Interpretive -- A competitor in the Adult Interpretive event must not exceed the requirements of the Adult Silver Free Skating event and he or she shall have passed no higher than the US Figure Skating Pre-Silver/Adult Pre-Silver Dance test. The program maximum length is 1:40 and shall be skated in accordance with 3821 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Masters Interpretive -- A competitor in the Masters Interpretive Free Skating event must meet the minimum requirements of the Adult Gold or Adult Masters Free Skating event, or passed at least one of the Silver/Adult Silver dances. The program maximum length is 1:40 and shall be skated in accordance with 3811 in the 2009 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

INTERPRETIVE IMPROV

During the scheduled skating warm up, skaters will listen twice to music selected for this event. Skaters will then skate to the same music. Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Judging will be on interpretation, style and composition. Professionals will not be allowed to help entrants in this event. Men and women may compete against each other. Conservative dress is encouraged. Qualifications to compete in a given level are the same as freestyle. Length of music will be 1:00 for Non-test through Intermediate and 1:30 for Novice through Senior and Adult Non-test through Adult Masters.

SOLO DANCE

There will be only one round in each of the solo dance categories. The number of dance sequences will be announced by the referee. Men and women will compete against one another in solo dances. Men will skate men's steps and ladies will skate ladies' steps.

Preliminary -- Open to those who have not completed Pre-Bronze Dance test. Dancer will dance the Rhythm Blues.

Pre-Bronze -- Open to those who have not completed Bronze Dance test. Dancer will dance the Fiesta Tango.

Bronze -- Open to those who have not completed Pre-Silver Dance test. Dancer will dance the Hickory Hoedown.

Pre-Silver -- Open to those who have not completed Silver Dance test. Dancer will dance the Fourteenstep.

Silver -- Open to those who have passed one Silver Dance test but not more than one Pre-Gold Dance test. Dancer will dance the Rocker Fox-trot.

Pre-Gold -- Open to those who have passed the Silver Dance test or higher. Dancer will dance the Kilian.

Gold -- Open to those who have passed the Pre-Gold Dance test or higher. Dancer will dance the Quickstep.

COACHES, PARENTS AND SKATERS - PLEASE READ!!!

Because of the size of our competition and the number of skaters attending, if you wish to have practice ice it is very important for you sign up ahead of time. We cannot guarantee that short-notice or walk-on practice ice will be available.

Practice ice sessions will begin on Wednesday. Once we have the event schedule from the referee, we will make every effort to schedule your practice ice either the evening before or the morning of your event. However, there is no guarantee of this. Therefore, it would be best to schedule your arrival as close to Wednesday as possible.

It is extremely important for you to fill out your practice ice request with the **correct level at which you will be competing for each event** and with the **correct event****. If you mark an incorrect level or event on your practice ice request form, your practice ice time could end up being scheduled after the event in which you are actually competing!!!

****We are asking that coaches verify the levels and events and sign the form to minimize errors.**

No Changes - No Refunds. Practice ice money is non-refundable, and you may not assign your practice ice to another skater.

Music: Depending on the number of skaters on each practice ice session, there is no guarantee each skater's music will be played. Music will be randomly drawn and we will play as many as we have time for.

Practice Ice Schedules: Will not be available by phone or email and are not automatically sent out with the event schedules. If you wish to receive a practice ice schedule you must enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope, and send it along with the practice ice request form and separate payment, **separate from your official entry forms, to the practice ice chair**. 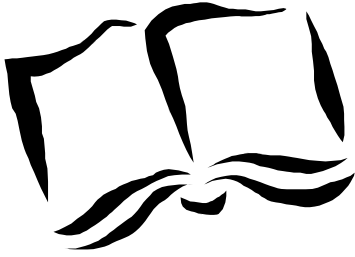

Rules on the NEW and FUN Gong Artistic / Showcase
This year the JHFSC is hosting the First Ever Gong Event !!!

We hope this event will be fun for the Skaters, the Audience, and the Judges.

The event will run on Saturday night before the skater's party, there are three groups, Low, Medium, and High. The skaters will enter in the group at their current freestyle level as of January 26, 2009. If there are enough skaters per group, the groups will be divided again by test levels. Skaters must be at the Pre-Preliminary level or higher. Skaters may also skate with the same music of their Artistic or Showcase programs, and may enter in one or all of these different events. Skaters may use a hand held prop, but they are not allowed to be placed on the ice. For this event there will be a gong on the judge's stand, any time after 45 seconds from the start of the skaters program one or all of the judges may stand and go to the gong and stop the program. Judges may also stop the other judges from gonging a skater, or the audience can encourage the judges to stop or move to the gong. If the skater is gonged they will stop the music and call the next skater. **"JUDGING"** all skaters will be given a mark, and remember that even if you are gonged the other judges can still place you first, judges marks are often different in Artistic and Showcase events. We want this to be a NEW FUN EVENT; this is not to make a skater feel bad about their skating, but to have fun with the audience and judges. REMEMBER this is meant to be a fun event, but parents do not sign your skater up for this event, if a **GONG** may hurt or discourage your child.
