The Jackson Hole Invitational is a non-qualifying competition sanctioned by United States Figure Skating (US Figure Skating). The Jackson Hole Invitational will be conducted according to the rules set forth in the 2010/2011 US Figure Skating Rulebook and in the Technical Notifications published on the US Figure Skating Website.

ELIGIBILITY

Skaters must be registered members of US Figure Skating or friendly foreign federations. Skaters representing a foreign association must include official permission of their Association or Federation.

UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED IN THIS ANNOUNCEMENT, COMPETITORS MAY ENTER ONE CLASS HIGHER THAN THEIR TEST LEVEL AS OF JANUARY 31, 2011

Eligibility for the basic skills part of the competition

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills Program/Club or any other Basic Skills Program/Club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8 must skate at highest level passed and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances. For the Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

COMPETITION EVENTS AND FEES

Entries will close on January 31, 2011, and must be postmarked by that date. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee and will be charged a \$30.00 late fee. Entry fees and completed forms for each event entered must be sent together. A minimum of two entries will make an event. All events are separate. No refunds will be issued after the close of entries on January 31, 2011.

RINK FACILITIES

The Snow King Ice Arena has an indoor ice surface 200' x 85' with rounded corners. Dressing rooms and snack bar facilities are available. There is bleacher seating in the arena.

REGISTRATION

The registration desk will open in the competition arena at 4:00 p.m. March 9, 2011. **Skaters are required to check in at the registration desk at least one (1) hour prior to their first scheduled event.** The referee may begin any competition event up to 30 minutes early.

MUSIC

All competitors except interpretive improvisation must provide their own music on CD (no CD-RWs, DVD-R or mini discs allowed). **Each CD must be clearly marked with the skater's name, and event, side to be played, and length of program.** There must be only one program on a CD, with no more than a 5 second lead in. Please bring two copies of each CD, in case a backup is needed. **Music must be turned in one (1) hour prior to the event to be skated and picked up following the event.** The Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club is not responsible for any music not picked up by the end of the competition.

COACH REGISTRATION

In accordance with current rules, all coaches participating in this event must be registered with U.S. Figure Skating. For more information on the registration process, please visit <http://www.usfigureskating.org>. We will provide all registered coaches with a credential. Every coach in attendance will be required to check in at the registration table and must show a picture I.D. to receive their credential. We strongly recommend that you also bring any registration confirmation materials. Coaches must wear their badge at all times when coaching skaters at rink side of a sanctioned competition. Monitors will be instructed to ensure that anyone standing rink side has their credential. The only exception is for coaches under 18 years of age or for coaches who only have Basic Skills students.

OFFICIAL NOTES

The official schedule showing starting times for each event and the draw will be posted in the arena. The official schedule supersedes all other schedules. Notices posted on the official competition bulletin board are considered as sufficient notice to all competitors. The official schedule is tentative and subject to change.

CHANGES TO EVENT ENTRIES

Changes or additions to event entries after skating the orders are posted will be permitted at the discretion of the Chief Accountant. If the changes/additions are permitted by the Chief Accountant, a \$10/event change fee will be collected by the JHFSC.

PRIVACY POLICY

Information provided to the host club on the entry form is intended for internal use of the competition committee, chief referee, and chief accountant only. We will never intentionally disclose any personal information about you (such as, for example, your full name, street address, telephone number, or e-mail address) to any third party without having received your permission.

AWARDS

Medals will be presented to the top three (3) winners in each group. Ribbons will be presented to the fourth place winner in each group. All Basic Skills not in 1st through 4th place will receive participant ribbons. Trophies will be presented to the top three winners of the Intermediate through Senior Combined Short & Long Program (medals will be presented for the individual short and long program winners). There will be no final rounds.

There will be a 1st, 2nd & 3rd place Team Trophy awarded to the clubs with most points at the end of the competition, using a scoring system for each event as follows 1st place=5 points / 2nd place=3 points / 3rd place=1 point. **No points for team events.** The Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club is ineligible to receive a Team Trophy.

The Artistry Award. The judges will give this award to a skater Juvenile (Adult Gold) or higher who skates the most artistic Free Skate or Artistic program at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

The Sherrie Fleuter Award. The judges will give this award to a skater of any level who demonstrates excellence in both artistic and freestyle skating and also represents the spirit of figure skating at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

The Stacey Findorff Award. The judges will give this award to a skater who is at the Basic Skills through Non-Test level and demonstrates excellence in both artistic and freestyle skating while also representing the spirit of Figure Skating at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

The Stillwell Award. The judges will give this award to a skater of any level who performs the most highly entertaining and creative showcase program at the Jackson Hole Invitational. The trophy will remain in the JHFSC showcase, with the skater's name engraved on it. The winning skater also receives a trophy from the Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club.

VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHS

An attempt will be made to provide videotaping and photography. Personal videotaping is allowed only with the permission of the competition chairman and is restricted to the arena bleachers, hand carried equipment only, and may not be connected to the rink electricity. A photographer will be present at the awards ceremonies. Picture arrangements may be made with him. **NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY** is allowed in the rink area during competition. Flash photography is dangerous to the skaters! The competition committee reserves the right to remove anyone from the rink who ignores requests and warnings regarding the use of flash photography. In addition, there will be no personal videotaping of other competitors during the competition. Awards photos are optional and will be available for personal or group photographs.

TRANSPORTATION

There are many ways to get to Jackson Hole. The easiest is to fly directly into the Jackson Hole Airport. If flying directly into Jackson Hole doesn't work for you, there are several other airports that are within a reasonable drive. Consider Salt Lake City, Utah (approximately 5 hours 15 minutes by car) or Idaho Falls, Idaho (approximately 90 minutes by car). If you don't want to drive, you can purchase roundtrip ground transportation to Jackson Hole on the Jackson Hole Express from the Idaho Falls Airport or the Salt Lake City International Airport. Transportation between Idaho Falls and Jackson Hole is \$70 round trip or \$40 one way. Transportation between Salt Lake City and Jackson Hole is \$130 round trip or \$70 one way. All Beginning Tots, Basic Skills, Free Skate 1 through 6, and Non-Test Events will be grouped by age, if possible.

Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile Freestyle and Adult Non-Test through Adult Masters Freestyle will also be grouped by age, if possible. All other events may be split at the discretion of the referee. All events may be combined or split at the referee's discretion.

Artistic will be skated as a rhythmic interpretation to music of the skater's choice. It will be judged on composition and style. The difficulty of jumps will be given no weight in the marks. Vocal music is permitted. Skaters are encouraged to wear conservative costumes, appropriate for their music. No props are allowed, including hand held. At the discretion of the referee, groups may be combined and/or divided according to the number of skaters entered.

Showcase will be skated to music of the skater's choice. This is a costume event. Costumes can be appropriate to the theme of the music. Props are limited to one trip on the ice, must be carried by skater and may not alter the ice surface, i.e. fire or water. Event will be judged on interpretation, style, composition and entertainment appeal.

Adult Interpretive and Adult Masters Interpretive Free Skating will consist of variety of skating moves and elements selected for their value in the skater's interpretation of the music (vocal music is permitted). Costumes that enhance the performance by appropriately reflecting the character of the music, thereby enhancing the theme, will be considered in the judging. Props on the ice will not be permitted. Judging will be based on both skating technique *and* presentation.

Interpretive Improv music will be played during the skaters group warm up, skaters will listen to music selected twice. Skaters will then skate to the music. Judging will be based on interpretation, style, and composition. Professionals will not be allowed to help skaters in this event. Conservative dress is encouraged.

Team Events will be judged on the 4 elements for each level.

JUDGING SYSTEM

All events except for the Juvenile through Senior Free Skate will be judged using the 6.0 closed judging system. Intermediate through Senior Short Programs and Juvenile through Senior Free Skate Events will be judged in accordance with the new Code Of Points judging system (ISU Judging System). **ALL SKATERS IN THESE CODE-OF-POINTS-JUDGED-EVENTS MUST SUBMIT THE PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM WITH THEIR ENTRY FORM.**

PRACTICE ICE

Each twenty (20) minute practice session will cost \$10.00. You must enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope to receive advance notice of your practice ice. Practice ice money is non-refundable. **You must bring your own tape or CD for practice ice.** Practice ice will be assigned in the order of receipt of reservations. See the **Practice Ice Request Form** for specifics.

HOSPITALITY FEE

All skaters will pay a \$15.00 fee. This fee helps to cover the cost Saturday night's party, goodie bag items, and other miscellaneous costs associated with the competition. **All skaters will pay the hospitality fee, even if they choose not to attend the St. Patrick Day Party.** Please see attached information sheet for more information about Saturday night's party!

Non-test -- Open to skaters who have passed no US Figure Skating test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

Pre-Preliminary -- Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

4. Waltz jump/toe loop combination

Preliminary -- **Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Preliminary Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:30 maximum; One-half ice surface.**

Pre-Juvenile -- Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:30 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Front scratch to back scratch
2. Camel Spin
3. Single Lutz Jump
4. Double Jump
5. Jump Combination two singles (No turn or change of foot in between)
6. Ina Bauer or Spread Eagle

Juvenile -- Open to skaters who have passed the US Figure Skating Juvenile Freestyle test and are 12 years and under as of January 29 2009. No music; Time - 1:30 maximum; Full ice surface.

1. Spin Combination 1 change of foot and 1 change position
2. Ladies: Layback Men: Forward Camel
3. Single Axel
4. Jump combination consisting of a double/single, single/double or two single jumps (No turn or change of foot in between).
5. Straight Line step sequence

Open Juvenile -- Same as Juvenile except 13 years and older as of January 31, 2011

Adult Non-Test -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed no US Figure Skating tests (Skate with Us Adult 1-4 tests OK). No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Two-foot spin (minimum: 3 revolutions)
2. Forward Edges (minimum 2 outside and 2 inside, skated consecutively)
3. Bunny Hop
4. Lunge
5. Forward Inside Pivot

Adult Pre-Bronze -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Pre-Bronze Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Waltz Jump
2. Toe-Loop
3. Half-Flip – Half-Flip combination
4. One Foot Spin (min. 3 revolutions)
5. Spiral

Adult Bronze -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Bronze Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:00 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Salchow
2. Toe-Loop
3. Waltz-Toe-Loop combination
4. Sit spin (min. 3 revolutions)
5. Circular footwork sequence

Adult Silver -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Silver Freestyle test. No music; Time - 1:30 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Flip
2. Loop
3. Single-Single combination jump
4. Camel Spin (min 3 revs in position)
5. Back spin
6. Straight-line footwork sequence

Adult Gold/Masters -- Open to skaters 21 years and older who have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Gold Freestyle test or the US Figure Skating Juvenile (or higher) Freestyle Test. No music; Time - 1:30 maximum; One-half ice surface.

1. Axel
2. Lutz-Loop combination
3. Camel back sit spin (minimum 4 revolutions each)
4. Circular footwork sequence
5. Layback (ladies) or Cross-foot (men) spin

BASIC SKILLS FREE SKATE

BASIC SKILLS EVENTS ARE OPEN TO SKATERS OF ALL AGES. Where entries permit, groups within events will be divided by age and gender where possible. Skaters competing in the Basic Skills Snowplow Sam through Basic 8 events must not have passed any USFS tests including Moves in the Field and individual dance tests. Skaters in Snowplow Sam through Basic 8 are required and restricted to competing at the highest level passed. Skaters in Free Skate 1-6 may compete no higher than one level above current level. A skater may not enter more than one level. For the Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level).

Each program must be well balanced and contain the following required elements to be skated in any order (taken from US Figure Skating Basic Skills handbook). The elements are not restricted to the number of times an element is executed, or lengths of glides, number of revolutions in a spin, etc., unless otherwise stated. Additional elements may be added from lower levels. Deductions will be made if elements from a higher level are skated. Music duration is limited to stated program duration, plus or minus 10 seconds. All programs will be skated on a full sheet of ice.

SNOWPLOW SAM & Tots:

1. March followed by a two foot glide and dip
2. Forward two foot swizzles 2-3-in a row
3. Backward wiggles 2-6 in a row
4. Forward snowplow stop

BASIC 1 FREE SKATE:

1. Forward two foot glide and dip
2. Forward two foot swizzles 6 -8 in a row
3. Backward wiggles 6-8 in a row
4. Forward snowplow stop

BASIC 2 FREE SKATE:

1. Forward two foot glide – either foot
2. Two foot turn in place – forward to backward
3. Backward two foot swizzles 6 -8 in a row
4. Forward alternation ½ swizzle pumps, in a straight line – 2-3 each foot
5. Moving snowplow stop

BASIC 3 FREE SKATE:

1. Forward stroking
2. Forward ½ swizzle pumps on a circle, either clockwise or counter clockwise 4 -6 consecutive
3. Backward one foot glide - either foot
4. Forward slalom
5. Two foot spin – minimum three revolutions

BASIC 4 FREE SKATE:

1. Forward crossovers 4-6 consecutive both directions
2. Standstill forward outside three turn - R & L
3. Backward stroking – 4-6 strokes
4. Backward snowplow stop - R or L

BASIC 5 FREE SKATE:

1. Backward crossovers 4-6 consecutive in both directions
2. Basic one-foot spin – free leg held to side of spinning leg – minimum three revolutions
3. Side Toe hop -either direction
4. Hockey stop

BASIC 6 FREE SKATE:

1. Standstill forward inside three-turn - R & L
2. Bunny Hop
3. Forward arabesque spiral on a straight line R or L
4. Lunge - R or L
5. T-stop - R or L

BASIC 7 FREE SKATE:

1. Forward inside open Mohawk - R to L and L to R
2. Ballet Jump either direction
3. Back crossovers to a back outside edge landing position clockwise and counter clockwise
4. Forward inside pivot

BASIC 8 FREE SKATE:

1. Moving forward outside or forward inside three turns R & L
2. Waltz jump
3. Mazurka in either direction
4. 1 combination move - clockwise or counter clockwise - two forward crossovers into FI Mohawk, step behind, step into one back crossover and step to a forward inside edge
5. Beginning one-foot upright spin – free foot held to side of spinning leg or crossed position – minimum three revolutions

FREE SKATE EVENTS

For the Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise stated. To be skated on full ice. The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use, but is not required to use, any additional elements from a previous level. A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level. Vocal music is allowed. Music duration: 1:30 minutes (+/- 10 seconds).

FREE SKATE 1:

1. Advanced forward stroking 4-6 strokes
2. One-foot upright scratch spin from back crossovers-minimum three revolutions
3. Waltz jump from back crossovers
4. Half flip jump

FREE SKATE 2:

1. Forward outside spiral R or L
2. Beginning back spin
3. Waltz jump, side toe hop, waltz jump
4. Toe loop

FREE SKATE 3:

1. Forward crossovers in a figure 8
2. Back spin – minimum three revolutions
3. Salchow
4. Waltz jump/Toe loop or Salchow/toe loop

FREE SKATE 4:

1. Forward power 3's, 2-3 consecutive R or L
2. Sit spin – minimum three revolutions
3. Loop jump
4. Waltz jump/loop jump

FREE SKATE 5:

1. Camel spin – minimum three revolutions
2. Forward upright spin to back upright spin - minimum three revolutions each foot
3. Loop/loop combination jump
4. Flip jump

FREE SKATE 6:

1. Camel/sit spin combination, minimum four revolutions total
2. Split or stag jump
3. Waltz jump/1/2 loop /Salchow combination
4. Lutz jump

COMPETITIVE TEST TRACK

Skaters may enter EITHER the competitive test track free skate program or the well-balanced track free skate program but NOT both during the same non-qualifying competition. Your Coach should recommend which track. Competitors will skate to music of their choice. Deductions WILL be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description. Vocal music is allowed for all levels. For the Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters must be 20 years of age or younger on the competition date.

PRE-PRELIMINARY FREE SKATE:

Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Open to skaters who have not passed the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3710 in the Rulebook. Axels are permitted. No double jumps are permitted. Maximum of 5 jumping elements. Maximum of 2 spins of a different nature. One step sequence utilizing ½ the ice surface.

PRELIMINARY FREE SKATE:

Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Free Skate test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skate test. Program in accordance with 3700 in the Rulebook. One jump must be an axel/waltz jump jump-type jump. Maximum 5 jumping elements. Maximum of 2 spins of a different nature. One step sequence utilizing ½ the ice surface.

PRE-JUVENILE FREE SKATE:

Program Duration: 2 Minutes (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3690 in the Rulebook. Program may include an axel, and up to four different double jumps. Double jumps may be repeated in jump sequence or jump combination.

JUVENILE FREE SKATE: Open to skaters 12 years of age or under at close of entries.

OPEN JUVENILE FREE SKATE: Open to skaters 13 years of age or older at the close of entries.

FOR EITHER EVENT:

Program Duration: 2 Minutes 15 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3680 in the Rulebook. SHORT PROGRAMS: Use requirement 3640-3671 in the Rulebook.

INTERMEDIATE FREE SKATE:

Short program maximum duration: 2 minutes.

Free Skate program duration: 2 minutes 30 seconds (+/- 10 Seconds).

Open to skaters under 18 years of age.

Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Novice Free Skate Test. Free Skate program in accordance with 3672 in the Rulebook and Short program in accordance with 3671 in the Rulebook.

NOVICE FREE SKATE:

Short program maximum duration: 2 minutes 30 seconds.

Free Skate program duration: 3 minutes for ladies and 3 minutes 30 seconds for men (+/- 10 Seconds).

Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Junior Free Skate Test. Free Skate program in accordance with 3663 in the Rulebook and Short program in accordance with 3662 in the rule book.

JUNIOR FREE SKATE:

Short program maximum duration: 2 minutes 50 seconds.

Free Skate program duration: 3 minutes 30 seconds for ladies and 4 minutes for men (+/- 10 Seconds).

Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Novice Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Senior Free Skate Test. Free Skate program in accordance with 3653 the Rulebook and Short program in accordance with 3651 (men) or 3652 (ladies) in the rulebook (group B elements).

SENIOR FREE SKATE:

Short program maximum duration: 2 minutes 50 seconds.

Free Skate program duration: 4 minutes for ladies and 4 minutes 30 seconds for men (+/- 10 Seconds).

Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Junior Free Skate Test or the Senior Free Skating Test. Free Skate program in accordance with 3643 the Rulebook and Short program in accordance with 3641 (men) or 3642 (ladies) in the rulebook.

ADULT FREE SKATE

Events may be combined by age, sex, or level at the discretion of the Referee in order to give skaters an opportunity to compete. Where events at the different levels are combined, the elements from the lowest level will be skated. Men and women will be separated where possible. Please note that +/- 10 Second time allowances do not apply to Adult Events.

YOUNG ADULT BRONZE FREE SKATE:

Free Skate program maximum duration: 1 minute 50 seconds.

Open to skaters ages 18 - 20 as of close of entries who have passed no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skate test. NO AXEL OR MULTI-REVOLUTION JUMPS ALLOWED. Program in accordance with 3800 in the Rulebook.

ADULT BRONZE FREE SKATE:

Free Skate program maximum duration: 1 minute 50 seconds.

Open to skaters 21 years and older as of close of entries who have passed no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Adult Bronze Free Skating Test or the Preliminary Free Skating Test. NO AXEL OR MULTI-REVOLUTION JUMPS ALLOWED. Program in accordance with 3800 in the Rulebook.

YOUNG ADULT SILVER FREE SKATE:

Free Skate program maximum duration: 2 minutes 10 seconds.

Open to skaters ages 18 - 20 as of close of entries who have passed no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3790 in the Rulebook.

ADULT SILVER FREE SKATE:

Free Skate program maximum duration: 2 minutes 10 seconds.

Open to skaters 21 years and older as of close of entries who have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Adult Bronze Free Skating Test, but no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile or the Adult Gold Free Skating Test. Program in accordance with 3790 in the Rulebook.

YOUNG ADULT GOLD FREE SKATE:

Free Skate program maximum duration: 2 minutes 40 seconds.

Open to skaters ages 18 - 20 as of close of entries who have passed no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3780 in the Rulebook.

ADULT GOLD FREE SKATE:

Freeskate program maximum duration: 2 minutes 40 seconds.

Open to skaters 21 years and older as of close of entries who have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Adult Silver Free Skating Test, but no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3780 in the Rulebook.

ADULT MASTER FREE SKATE:

Adult Masters -- Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Gold Free Skating Test or the US Figure Skating Juvenile (or higher) Free Skating Test. Program maximum length of 3:40 and skated in accordance with 3741 in the 2010 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

ARTISTIC

Skate time durations adhere to National Showcase requirements. This event is to be skated as a rhythmic interpretation of the music selected by the skater; vocal or instrumental music may be used. Qualifications to compete in a given level are the same as the requirements for the same free skating level. One mark will be awarded based on the program components as described in the Rulebook. Any jumps, spins, and footwork sequences incorporated into the program should be to enhance the above components. Base value and difficulty level of technical elements will not be a consideration in assigning the final mark. Novelty effects, such as lip-synching or dancing in place, are not desirable. Costumes should be in accordance with U.S. Figure Skating rules. Props, including hand-held, are not allowed. At the discretion of the referee, groups may be combined and/or divided. Males and females will compete against each other.

Program duration (no minimum requirement):

- No Test, Limited Beginner, Beginner through Pre-Juvenile – 1:40 minutes maximum
- Juvenile through Novice – 2:10 minutes maximum
- Junior and Senior – 2:40 minutes maximum
- Adults – 1:40 minutes maximum (this time matches Adult Nationals requirements)

SHOWCASE

Skate time durations adhere to National Showcase requirements. These events are designed to portray a character or theme through the use of music and costume. One mark will be awarded based on the following criteria:

- 1) Entertainment value. This principal element is comprised of showmanship, artistic, and theatrical qualities, and audience appeal.
- 2) Music and choreography. The performance must fit the music. The routine should use the full ice surface with the skating elements reflecting musical interpretation. Creativity and originality will be credited.
- 3) Skating. Skating elements should carry out the mood of the music/choreography and will be judged on how they enhance the performance and interpretation of the music. Difficulty of moves/elements will not be a factor. Choreography and skating ability should be consistent with the skating level entered.
- 4) Costumes and props. Costumes and props should reflect the music and must be appropriate for the performance and age of the skater. A prop must be incorporated into the performance and not just scenery. Props must be carried on and off the ice by the skater in a reasonable amount of time. If insufficient entries are received, levels may be combined at the discretion of the referee. Males and females will compete against each other.

Program duration (no minimum requirement):

- No Test, Limited Beginner, Beginner through Pre-Juvenile – 1:40 minutes maximum
- Juvenile through Novice – 2:10 minutes maximum
- Junior and Senior – 2:40 minutes maximum
- Adults – 1:40 minutes maximum (this time matches Adult Nationals requirements)

ADULT INTERPRETIVE/MASTERS INTERPRETIVE

Adult Interpretive and Adult Masters Interpretive Free Skating shall consist of a variety of skating moves and elements selected for their value in enhancing the skater's interpretation of the music he or she has chosen. Axels and double jumps will not be permitted. Costumes that enhance the performance by appropriately reflecting the character of the music, thereby enhancing the theme, will be considered in the judging. Props on the ice will not be permitted. Two marks will be given by the judges...the first for **Skating Technique** and the second for **Presentation**. **Skating Technique** includes: the ease, flow, glide, sureness, power, and depth of edges; the ability to vary the speed and direction of the skating; the variety of expressive and innovative moves; the succession of movement within the program; the utilization of space and ice coverage; and style. **Presentation** includes: the interpretation of the music and rhythm; the skater's musical timing and understanding of the phrasing of music; the use of the entire body to develop artistic and music expression; creativity; choreography and the art of arranging movements; variations in tempo, tension, emotion, and movements; the suitability of the music to the skater; and the internal motivation of movements and expression projected to the audience. Vocal music is permitted.

Adult Interpretive -- A competitor in the Adult Interpretive event must not exceed the requirements of the Adult Silver Free Skating event and he or she shall have passed no higher than the US Figure Skating Pre-Silver/Adult Pre-Silver Dance test. The program maximum length is 1:40 and shall be skated in accordance with 3821 in the 2010 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

Masters Interpretive -- A competitor in the Masters Interpretive Free Skating event must meet the minimum requirements of the Adult Gold or Adult Masters Free Skating event, or passed at least one of the Silver/Adult Silver dances. The program maximum length is 1:40 and shall be skated in accordance with 3811 in the 2010 US Figure Skating Rule Book.

INTERPRETIVE IMPROV

During the scheduled skating warm up, skaters will listen twice to music selected for this event. Skaters will then skate to the same music. Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Judging will be on interpretation, style and composition. Professionals will not be allowed to help entrants in this event. Men and women may compete against each other. Conservative dress is encouraged. Qualifications to compete in a given level are the same as freestyle. Length of music will be 1:00 for Non-test through Intermediate and 1:30 for Novice through Senior and Adult Non-test through Adult Masters.

Open to skaters in **LOW GROUP** Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Adult Pre-Bronze Adult Bronze Adult Silver. **MEDIUM GROUP** is Juvenile, Open Juvenile, Intermediate, and Adult Gold. **HIGH GROUP** is Novice, Junior, Senior and Adult Master. **COACHES GROUP** is for Coaches. **Groups will be determined by the skater's level and the number of skaters entered per GROUP. (All groups are open to single skaters or pair skaters)**

Qualifications to compete in a given GROUP are the same as the requirements for the free skating level. Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Interpretation, style, composition, and entertainment appeal shall be factors in determining the mark given. Costumes can be appropriate to the theme of the music. Any props must be hand held and **MAY NOT BE PLACED ON THE ICE**. Men and women may compete against each other.

The program duration for LOW GROUP shall be 1:00-1:30. The program duration for MEDIUM GROUP shall be 1:00-1:30. The program duration HIGH GROUP and COACHES GROUP shall be 1:30-2:00. (All times + or - 10sec). There will be limited time and space. Entries will be on a first come first serve. We will notify you if the time and space is filled up.

TEAM EVENTS

Teams must compete at the highest freestyle test level of the skaters. Teams consist of 4 skaters, male or female. All teams at the same level will be on the ice together. One member of each team will be required to do one of the four elements (all elements must be completed). Choose one element for each skater. Elements will be judged one at a time against the other teams' elements. Teams may consist of skaters from different clubs. Adults may join or form teams at their equivalent level. Each skater will be awarded one mark for technique.

Because of the size of our competition and the number of skaters attending, if you wish to have practice ice it is very important for you sign up ahead of time. We cannot guarantee that short-notice or walk-on practice ice will be available.

We hope this event will be fun for the Skaters, the Audience, and the Judges.

The event will run on Saturday night before the skater's party, there are three groups, Low, Medium, High and Coach. The skaters will enter in the group at their current freestyle level as of January 31, 2011, we have added this year a pair group in each level. If there are enough skaters per group, the groups will be divided again by test levels. Skaters must be at the Pre-Preliminary level or higher. Skaters may also skate with the same music of their Artistic or Showcase programs, and may enter in one or all of these different events. Skaters may use a hand held prop, but they are not allowed to be placed on the ice. For this event there will be a gong on the judge's stand, any time after 45 seconds from the start of the skaters program one or all of the judges may stand and go to the gong and stop the program.
