



Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club Program, Member, and Participant Rules

Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club Program, Member, and Participant Rules are necessary to keep our program running smoothly and to ensure that every participant receives equal consideration. Please become familiar with and respect the following guidelines. Ice time in Jackson is extremely precious...let's make the most of it!

General Rules

1. Respect must be shown to coaches, monitors, and to other skaters by all participants on and off ice.
2. No foul language will be tolerated at any time while participating in a JHFSC Program.
3. All participants are expected to respect the Snow King Center Ice Arena. We are fortunate to have access to this facility. Dressing rooms and other areas are to be left clean and all debris picked up and put into trash containers.
4. The Jackson Hole Figure Skating Club office is a private office. Appointments made by parents and students are welcomed. Only JHFSC coaches, officers, chairmen, board members, or volunteers on official club business may use this office without an appointment.
5. Children are not permitted behind the counter of the Snow King Center Ice Arena.

Ice Rules

1. ARRIVE AT THE ICE RINK AT LEAST 15 MINUTES BEFORE THE START OF YOUR SESSION OR LESSON. It is wasteful and disrespectful to arrive at the rink when your lesson or session starts. Plan on fifteen minutes to put on your skates and skating gear. This will ensure that we do not waste even one minute of ice time. (Every ten minutes of wasted ice time costs us \$22.50 plus coaching fees.) You can show your love of and commitment to figure skating by placing a high value on the ice that is made available to you. ALWAYS BE READY TO TAKE THE ICE AT THE VERY START OF YOUR SESSION OR LESSON.
2. Every participant must check-in with the monitor before entering the ice for the session/lesson. If you are late, make sure you check in with your coach before you join a class that is already in session.
3. If you are in a lesson and need to leave the ice for any reason, notify your coach before leaving the ice.
4. Please use the dressing rooms for changing and for putting on skates.
5. Proper skating attire is highly requested.
6. Safe skating is essential. Our staff, officers, chairmen, and/or members-in-charge are authorized to order a participant from the ice for cause. All participants are expected to be considerate of other skaters at all times.
7. No hockey sticks, pucks, gum, or food are allowed on figure skating ice.
8. Ice is for skating, not visiting. If you must visit, please leave the ice.
9. Parents should ensure that participants are appropriately dressed with skates snugly tied prior to the start of a program. This is not the responsibility of staff professionals.
10. Do not interrupt coaches, staff, or volunteers while they are in a lesson.
11. Do not intentionally kick holes in the ice.
12. Leave the ice immediately when the end of the session is announced or the zamboni enters the rink.

Club Practice Ice Sessions

1. There will be no more than 26 skaters on the ice during JHFSC low freestyle, dance/moves, and high freestyle sessions. Walk-ons will be allowed only after all "season" participants have taken the ice.
2. Music will be played by rotation in the order the tapes are turned in.
3. Each skater will have the opportunity to have one program played before any skaters are able to play a second (or third) program.
4. Professional staff in lessons may play one program per lesson without "waiting in line." Professional staff requests will be alternated with participant requests, so that participants have the opportunity to have programs played during busy times.
5. The ice monitor has the final authority on the playing of the music.
6. The skater whose music is being played has the right of way. All other skaters must yield.
7. During dance sessions, the dance announced takes precedence. If dancers wish to dance other dance patterns, they must yield to those who follow the announced pattern.

Snow King Music Playing Policy

1. No personal music will be permitted by Snow King on weekend public sessions.
2. Personal music will be permitted by Snow King during weekday public sessions any time there are less than 10 non-JHFSC members on the ice. When personal music is played during weekday public ice, each individual program may be played no more than two times per session.

Skaters who will not follow the above rules may be asked to leave the ice by the monitor, professional, staff member, or club officer. Their names will be recorded and parents will be called by the club after repeated or serious infractions of the rules. Loss of ice privileges may ensue.
